Belgium, Thursday February 18th, 2010

I wake up. The clock says 7:20 a.m. I take a shower, dress up and go downstairs eat breakfast with my dad. My mom is already at work. She is a secretary. My dad asks me what I want on my sandwich for lunch at school and fixes it (I am spoiled).

At 8:10, I am ready to leave and my dad drives me to the school on his way to work. I go meet with my friends in the cafeteria. I give a kiss on the cheek to everybody and say "hi." We talk together and wait for the bell to ring at 8:40.

The bell goes off. Here we go, the day has started. We begin with two hours of Dutch. We go with the teacher to the language laboratory and we discover that we are having a surprise listening test. Everybody moans.

When the test is done, we go back to our classroom and we correct the homework due today. Then, the teacher asks us to present a conversation in Dutch with a partner. After 20 minutes of preparation, we have to do it before the class. Of course, nobody wants to be the first and the teacher picks someone. At the end of the two periods, she gives us an assignment for tomorrow.

It is 10:20 now and it is time for a break of 20 minutes. We all go outside and I meet with my friends again who had other classes. I eat a snack and drink a carton of juice like kids do.

At 10:40, the bell rings again. Time to go back in class. I go now to P.E. for two hours. All the girls change in the locker room and try to take as much time as possible to waste time. Girls don't like P.E.

The class starts and the teacher wants us to do gymnastic exercises. The weakest student in P.E. (like me) let the best ones to do the exercises first and hope that the class will be over before their turn.

Ten minutes before the bell rings, at 12:10, the teacher releases us. We run to the locker room to change because the math teacher doesn't want us to be late.

After I stuffed my things in my sport bag, I finally arrive in class with my messy hair. We have a test that everyone knew about. I take my calculator and all the things I need out of my backpack and start to focus. Of course, I have ten million questions to ask to the teacher about the test.

When I'm done with the test, it is at last time for lunch. The clock says 1:10 p.m. and my belly says "give me food." So, I take my lunch from my bag and go to the lunchroom to eat with my friends. In the lunchroom, there are sixteen tables and each one is full with 8 students. I start to eat and my friends talk about the math test we just had and about the unfairness of it. The teacher asked us a question that wasn't in the book. It always happens.

We are done eating after 25 minutes and we keep talking until the bell rings at 2:10. When it is nice outside, we leave the lunchroom earlier to take advantage of the sun outside.

When lunchtime is over, we spread out and go to our class. For me, I have German lesson. I go to our room but don't hurry too much because the teacher is always late.

When she finally arrives, she starts to teach us the next twenty German irregular verbs on the list of 148 ones we need to know. Then, we study two pages of vocabulary that she asks us to know by heart for the next week. Of course, she will also give us an assignment for the next day too.

After that period, it is time for religion class. Since I am in a Catholic public school, everybody has to take it. However, it is about to be the end of the day and that class is hard to follow without being distracted. Indeed, the teacher talks all period long.

Finally, at 3:50, the last 50 minutes of school start with science class. We all go to the science laboratory. It is amazing how our science teacher can see from miles away that somebody is chewing gum.

When she is done sending everybody to the trashcan, she teaches us how a vehicle gas motor works. At the end of the period, she gives us an assignment for the next day and tells us that we will have a test on Monday.

The bell rings, it is 4:40. Release, we are dismissed. All the students come from everywhere in the hall and go back home. When I'm lucky, my mom will be parked by the school but, today, as most of the time, she is late from her job. She will try to blame the road traffic on her way back and I won't buy it.

I make up my mind and start to study German first and then, I will come back to it after I am done with my assignments. At 5:40, a friend texts me to ask questions about the science assignment.

It is now 7:00 p.m., My dad comes back from work. He is a computer engineer. We eat together with my mom. Today, she fixed steamed potatoes, lettuce and a steak for supper. My mom talks about her day, my dad listens to her and I make interruptions to say what I want to say such as "did you talk to each other about my idea to be an exchange student in America?"

When we are done eating, I go back to my room and finish my work. At 8:00, I am finally done. I check my schedule to see if I have all the books I need for class tomorrow because we don't have lockers at school. We need to carry everything we need for the day or to leave it in our class at our own risk. So, tomorrow, I have Spanish, math, German, geography, Dutch, science, French, and math again to finish the day.


