# Helping Kids Reach Their Full Potential

Arnold Public Schools is excited to become a chapter for the Teammates Mentoring Program. Teammates is a school-based mentoring program started by Tom and Nancy Osborne. It is a program made especially for children in the 5th through 8th grades.

Did you know that statistics show that involvement of a mentor in a student's life significantly enhances their life for the better as they are in high school, college, and their careers? The vision of Teammates is to inspire youth to reach their full potential, to reach their full strengths, and to become more solid adults. Arnold Public Schools is hoping that through Teammates, Arnold students will be able to do this.

There are approximately 100 chapters in Nebraska. There are multiple chapters in Iowa and California.

"It's a good opportunity for our stu-

dents to have someone special in our lives. It is a good way for our school to get involved in the community," said Mrs. Lewis, "Initially 22 students showed interest, and I am waiting for their parental permission forms so I can match them up with mentors."

Teammates mentors will meet with the child they are matched with every Tuesday. They will eat with each other over lunch hour. They have dubbed these Tuesday lunch meetings "Teammates Tuesdays".

An anonymous quote on the

teammates website ([www.teammates.org](http://www.teammates.org)) said, "I am letting you know that I appreciate you coming in every week out of your busy schedule. I really love spending time with you, it's the highlight of my week! I love how open we get in our conversations because I usually never open up to people as I did with you [...] I am really lucky being matched up with you as my teammate [...] if it wasn't for you I don't think I would have my driver's permit as I do now! I'm really glad that you and I talk. Thank you so much for being my teammate."

"I hope they help me with making other kinds of friends,"

All Teammates programs are in the midst of the Coaches' challenge which is an effort to recruit more mentors. The challenge is between Nebraska, Iowa, Kansas, Michigan, as well as a few other Big Ten States.

Leron Bierman is in charge of coordinating and training the mentors.

Mrs. Lewis is in charge of coordinating our students. They are still needing another 11 mentors. They have 22 kids that signed up and only 11 mentors signed up. You only have to be 18 or older. No educational degree, diploma, or background is needed. They will give you the training you need.

"Teammates is a widely known across Nebraska as an organization that makes differences in the lives of children," said Mrs. Lewis, "I have always been interested in creating a Teammates chapter, but interests on

the part of the school board president, Duane Bowers, prompted me to start the application process."

# From the Principal's Desk



## SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT VISIT

It's a big year for Arnold Public Schools! We have an accreditation visit this year, which means that a team of school leaders from the area will be visiting sometime before April to make sure that we are headed in the right direction with our continuous school improvement goals for the coming years. APS is North Central Accredited, and they use a system called AdvancEd to track our progress. I will continue to update you on progress as the year passes.

## TERRA NOVA TESTS

We will again use a fall administration of Terra Nova tests in October. This online test is our chosen "norm referenced" assessment required by the state of Nebraska. Norm-referenced means it measures our scores against those of students in the same grade level across the nation. This is different from our NeSA scores, which are "criterion-referenced" or based on how well the students demonstrate mastery of the content of the test. Both scores are used by the state to determine the success of our district.

## ATTENDANCE REMINDERS

Here are a few reminders for the 2012-2013 school year:

- When your child misses school, call the day of the absence and let us know.
- Send a note for our records when your child returns to school after being ill, even when you have called. THIS IS A REQUIREMENT.
- High School athletes may not participate in practice if they miss any portion of the school day for illness. This includes "over-sleeping" and showing up to school significantly

late. If they are attending a scheduled appointment (doctor, dentist, etc.) and you bring a note from that appointment, they will be allowed to practice.

- If your child's hair is infested with lice, he/she will be sent home until there is no evidence of lice left in their hair.
- Absences beyond 10 days per semester and 20 days per year will be reported to the county attorney for excessive absenteeism. She will determine if truancy has occurred.
- School performance is strongly correlated to school attendance. While we do not want seriously ill children to attend school (fever, vomiting, etc.), please make every effort to keep your child in school with minor illnesses like the common cold.
- Plan family trips around school vacations whenever possible to ensure your child has the benefit of valuable class time with our teachers.

Keeping these concerns in mind will help your student to have a successful school year, and make our record keeping much simpler. Thank you for your cooperation!
